BYLAW NO. 2026-01

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE FEES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Brock No. 64, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Purpose

The purpose of this bylaw is to provide for the recovery of costs associated with the additional maintenance and restoration of municipal roads resulting from heavy or bulk hauling.

Short Name

This Bylaw shall be known as the *Infrastructure Maintenance Fee Bylaw*.

General

1. Every Oil Company shall pay to the Municipality a fee of \$2,500.00 (Two thousand, five hundred dollars), as an Infrastructure Maintenance Fee for all new oil and gas wells.
2. The Infrastructure Maintenance Fee shall cover the Municipality's cost of any gravel, extra road maintenance and overweight permits for all vehicles and equipment entering the lease during the drilling and completion of the well which includes the service rig and fracturing equipment; but does not include any equipment to prepare the wellsite. Once the well is active, any further work is classified as maintenance and subject to overweight permits and fees.
3. New oil and gas wells being drilled consecutively in the same time period with the other additional new wells on the same wellsite are exempt from the Infrastructure Maintenance Fee except for the first well drilled.
4. The \$2,500.00 Infrastructure Maintenance Fee also applies to any company passing through the Municipality with a drilling rig and/or associated vehicles and equipment.

Coming Into Force

This bylaw shall come into force upon the third and final reading of Council.

First Reading: April 15<sup>th</sup> 2026

Second Reading May 6<sup>th</sup> 2026
